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BE IT REMEMBERED That the Fayette County Legislative Body met in regular session at the Courthouse in Somerville, Tennessee, on the 23rd day of October, 2001.

Present and presiding the Honorable Jim Voss. Also present, Dell T. Graham, County Clerk, and the following County Commissioners: John W. Arnett, Floyd Bonner, Charles Dudley Brewer, Sr., Joe B. Burnette, Jr., Odis Cox, Carl Doyle, Ronnie Graves, Willie German, Ronnie Harris, David Kelley, Calvin Moore, Alonzo Morman, Jr., David Morris, John S. Sullivan, Sr., Rhea "Skip" Taylor, Wayne Thomas, and Myles Wilson.

Absent: Commissioners Sylvester Logan and Gordon M. Tomlin.

With a quorum being present, the following proceedings were had and entered of record, to-wit:

Motion was made by Commissioner Kelley, seconded by Commissioner Arnett and unanimously carried by the Board approving the minutes of the August and September meetings of this Board.

Chairman Voss requested Committee changes wherein Commissioner Carl Doyle would serve on the Development Committee and Commissioner Alonzo Morman would serve on the Education Committee. Motion was made by Commissioner Arnett, seconded by Commissioner Brewer and unanimously carried by the Board making this Committee appointment.

Motion was made by Commissioner Kelley, seconded by Commissioner Doyle and unanimously carried by the Board appointing **Wanda Mae Glover** as a **Notary Public**.

Reports from the Office of Trustee, Juvenile Court and the Sheriff's Department were filed.

Chairman Voss asked for comments on the refinancing of school bonds. He advised that refinancing at this time would save approximately \$350,000.00. No objection was voiced.

Reports were called for from the County Development Committee, the Education Committee, Criminal Justice Committee, Health & Welfare Committee and the Personnel Committee, but none presented.

Commissioner Harris, Chairman of the Budget Committee, then presented and moved for the adoption of A RESOLUTION MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE VARIOUS FUNDS, DEPARTMENTS, INSTITUTIONS, OFFICES AND AGENCIES OF FAYETTE COUNTY, TENNESSEE, FOR THE YEAR BEGINNING JULY 01, 2001 AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2002. Said motion was seconded by Commissioner Morris and unanimously carried by the Board adopting said Resolution as follows:

A RESOLUTION MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE VARIOUS FUNDS,
DEPARTMENTS, INSTITUTIONS, OFFICES AND AGENCIES OF
FAYETTE COUNTY, TENNESSEE, FOR THE
YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 2001 AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2002

SECTION 1. BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Fayette County, Tennessee, assembled in regular session on the 23rd day of October, 2001, that the amounts hereafter set out are hereby appropriated for the purpose of meeting the expenses of the various funds, departments, institutions, offices and agencies of Fayette County, Tennessee, for the capital outlay, and for meeting the payment of principal and interest on the County's debt maturing during the year beginning July 1, 2001 and ending June 30, 2002, according to the following schedule:

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that there are also hereby appropriated portions of the commissions and fees for collecting taxes and licenses and for administering other funds which the Trustee, County Clerk, Circuit Court Clerk, Clerk and Master, Register and the Sheriff and their officially authorized deputies and assistants may severally be entitled to receive under State laws heretofore or hereafter enacted. Expenditures on commissions, and/or fees collected by the Trustee, County Clerk, Circuit Court Clerk, Clerk and Master, Register and the Sheriff may be made for such purposes and in such amounts as may be authorized by existing law or by valid order of any court having power to make appropriations. Any excess commissions and/or fees collected over and above the expenditures authorized shall be paid over to the Trustee and converted into the General Fund as provided by law.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that if any fee officials, as enumerated in Section 8-22-101, TCA, operate under provisions of Section 8-22-104, TCA, provisions of the preceding paragraph shall not apply to those particular officials.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any amendment to the budget, except amendments to the budget for funds under supervision of Director of Schools, shall be approved as provided in Section 5-9-407. The Director of Schools must receive approval of the Board of Education for transfers within each major category of the budget, and approval of both the Board of Education and Board of County Commissioners for transfers between categories as required by law.

One copy of each amendment shall be filed with the County Clerk, one copy with the Chairman of the Budget Committee, and one copy with each divisional or departmental head concerned. The reason(s) for each transfer shall be clearly stated; however, this section shall in no case whatsoever be construed as authorizing transfer from one fund to another but shall apply solely to transfers within a certain fund.

SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any appropriations made by this resolution which cover the same purpose for which a specific appropriation is made by statute is made in lieu of but not in addition to said statutory appropriation. The salary, wages, remuneration of each officer, employee, or agent of the County shall not be in excess of the amounts authorized by existing law or as set forth in the estimate of expenditures which accompanies this resolution. Provided, however, that appropriations for such salaries, wages, or other remuneration hereby authorized shall in no case be construed as permitting expenditures for an office, agency, institution, division or department of the County in excess of the appropriation made herein for such office, agency, institution, division or department of the County. Such appropriation shall constitute the limit to the expenditures of any office, agency, institution, division or department for the year ending June 30, 2001. The aggregate expenditures for any item of appropriation shall in no instance be more than the amount herein appropriated for such item.

SECTION 5. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any resolution which may hereafter be presented to the Board of County Commissioners providing for appropriations in addition to those made by this Budget Appropriation Resolution shall specifically provide sufficient revenue or other funds, actually to be provided during the year in which the expenditure is to be made, to meet such additional appropriation. Said appropriating resolution shall be submitted to and approved by the State Director of Local Finance after its adoption as provided by Section 9-21-403, TCA.

SECTION 6. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Mayor and County Clerk are hereby authorized to borrow money on revenue anticipation notes, provided such notes are first approved by the Director of Local Finance, to pay for the expenses herein authorized until the taxes and other revenue for the year 2001-02 have been collected. The proceeds of loans for each individual fund shall not exceed 60% of the appropriations of each individual fund and shall be used only to pay the expenses and other requirements of the fund for which the loan is made. The loan shall be paid out of revenue from the fund for which money is borrowed. The notes evidencing the loans authorized under this section shall be issued under the applicable sections of Title 9, Chapter 21, Tennessee Code Annotated. Said notes shall be signed by the County Mayor and countersigned by the County Clerk and shall mature and be paid in full without renewal not later than June 30, 2002.

SECTION 7. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the delinquent County property taxes for the year 2000 and prior years and the interest and penalty thereon collected during the year ending June 30, 2002 shall be apportioned to the various County funds according to the subdivision of the tax levy for the year 2000. The Clerk and Master and the Trustee are hereby authorized and directed to make such apportionment accordingly.

SECTION 8. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all unencumbered balances of appropriations remaining at the end of the year shall lapse, and be of no further effect at the end of the year at June 30, 2002.

SECTION 9. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any resolution or part of a resolution which has heretofore been passed by the Board of County Commissioners which is in conflict with any provision in this resolution be and the same is hereby repealed.

SECTION 10. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution shall take effect from and after its passage and its provisions shall be in force from and after July 1, 2001. This resolution shall be spread upon the minutes of the Board of County Commissioners.

Passed this 23rd day of October, 2001.

Commissioner Harris then presented the following RESOLUTION FIXING THE TAX LEVY IN FAYETTE COUNTY, TENNESSEE FOR THE YEAR BEGINNING JULY 01, 2001 and moved for the adoption of same. Said motion was seconded by Commissioner Morman and was unanimously carried by the Board. Same being as follows:

SECTION 1. BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Fayette County, Tennessee, assembled in special session on this 23rd day of October, 2001, that the combined property tax rate for Fayette County, Tennessee for the year beginning July 1, 2001, shall be \$1.845 on each \$100.00 of taxable property, which is to provide revenue for each of the following funds and otherwise conform to the following levies: ..

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SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that there is hereby levied a gross receipts tax as provided by law. The proceeds of the gross receipts tax herein levied shall accrue to the General Fund.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all resolutions of the Board of County Commissioners of Fayette County, Tennessee, which are in conflict with this resolution are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution take effect from and after its passage, the public welfare requiring it. This resolution shall be spread upon the minutes of the Board of County Commissioners.

**A RESOLUTION MAKING APPROPRIATIONS TO NONPROFIT
CHARITABLE ORGANIZATIONS OF FAYETTE COUNTY,
TENNESSEE, FOR THE YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1ST, 2001,
AND ENDING JUNE 30TH, 2002**

WHEREAS, Section 5-9-109, TCA, authorizes the Fayette County Legislative Body to make appropriations to various nonprofit charitable organizations, and,
WHEREAS, the Fayette County Legislative Body recognizes the various nonprofit charitable organizations providing services in Fayette County have great need of funds to carry on their nonprofit charitable work.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Fayette County on this 23rd day of October, 2001.

SECTION 1. That Two Hundred Ten Thousand, Three Hundred Six Dollars and Seventy-Four Cents (\$210,306.74) be appropriated to nonprofit organizations in Fayette County as reflected below.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all appropriations enumerated in Section 1 above are subject to the following conditions:

1. That the nonprofit organizations to which funds are appropriated shall file with the County Clerk and the disbursing officials a copy of any annual report of its business affairs and transactions and the proposed use of the County's funds in accordance with rules promulgated by the Comptroller of the Treasury, Chapter 0380-2-7. Such annual report shall be prepared and certified by the chief financial officer of such nonprofit organization in accordance with Section 5-9-109 (c), TCA.
2. That said funds must only be used by the named nonprofit charitable organizations in furtherance of their nonprofit purposes benefiting the general welfare of the residents of Fayette County.
3. That it is the expressed interest of the County Commission of Fayette County in providing these funds to the above named charitable organizations to be fully in compliance with Chapter 0390-2-7 of the Rules of the Comptroller of the Treasury, and Section 5-9-109, TCA, and any and all other laws which may apply to county appropriations to nonprofit organizations and so this appropriation is made subject to compliance with any and all these laws and regulations.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Resolution shall take effect from and after its passage and its provisions shall be in force from and after July 1st, 2001. This Resolution shall be spread upon the minutes of the Board of County Commissioners.

Passed this 23rd day of October, 2001.

Motion was then made by Commissioner Harris, seconded by Commissioner Graves to approve the overall budget for the fiscal year 2001/2002 which includes a 4% salary increase for county employees and county officials with the exception of the Board of Education. Said motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Harris addressed the Board for the Reapportionment Committee. Daniel Carter, County Technical Assistance Service representative reviewed the proposed county map re-districting county legislative districts. After much discussion, motion was made by Commissioner Taylor, seconded by Commissioner Harris and unanimously carried by the Board accepting the motion and adopting the following Resolution:

**TO ADOPT A PLAN OF REAPPORTIONMENT DISTRICTING FOR THE
FAYETTE COUNTY LEGISLATIVE BODY**

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated 5-1-111 requires that, at least every ten (10) years, County Legislative Bodies shall change the boundaries of county legislative districts so that members represent substantially equal populations; and

WHEREAS, the Fayette County Legislative Body has reviewed the County Legislative districts population utilizing the 2000 United States Census; and,

WHEREAS, the Fayette County Legislative Body has prepared a plan of apportionment consistent with the provisions of Tennessee Code Annotated 5-1-111 and which provides for a county legislative body composed of 19 members and which creates 8 commissioner districts as described herein and as depicted on the Official Reapportionment Plan Map for Fayette County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Fayette County Legislative Body meeting in Regular Session at Somerville, Tennessee, on this 23th day of October, 2001, that:

SECTION 1

There is hereby adopted a plan of reapportionment for Fayette County as described herein, and which is served by a total County Legislative Body of 19 members elected from 8 districts. The districts for members of the County Legislative Body shall be as described below:

DISTRICT 1

Beginning at the intersection of State Highway 76 and Loosahatchie River; from said point of beginning northerly along State Highway 76 to its intersection with Smart Creek; thence southeasterly along Smart Creek to its intersection with Old Brownsville Road; thence southerly along Old Brownsville Road to its intersection with Old Jackson Road; thence easterly and northerly and northeasterly along Old Jackson Road to its intersection with an unnamed private drive; thence southeasterly along said drive to its intersection with U.S. Highway 64; thence northeasterly along U.S. Highway 64 to its intersection with Howell Creek; thence southeasterly and southerly along Howell Creek to its intersection with a TVA overhead electric transmission line; thence southwesterly along the TVA overhead electric transmission line to its intersection with LaGrange Road; thence southeasterly along LaGrange Road to its intersection with Bennetts Creek; thence southwesterly along Bennetts Creek to its intersection with Evergreen Drive; thence westerly along Evergreen Drive to its intersection with the Williston city limit line; thence northerly along the Williston city limit line to the northeast corner of the City of Williston; thence westerly along the Williston city limit line to its intersection with Jones Creek; thence northwesterly along Jones Creek to its intersection TVA Overhead Power line, thence westerly with the TVA overhead power liner to the intersection of Warren Road, thence northerly with Warren Road to the intersection of Feathers Chapel Drive, thence westerly with Feathers Chapel Road to the intersection with Rich Road, thence northerly with Rich Road to the intersection Stafford Road, thence easterly briefly with Stafford Road to the intersection of a small tributary to the Loosahatchie River, thence northerly to the Loosahatchie River; thence southeasterly along the Loosahatchie River to the point of beginning.

DISTRICT 2

Beginning at the intersection of Smart Creek and State Highway 76; from said point of beginning northerly and northeasterly along State Highway 76 to the north boundary line of Fayette County; thence easterly along the north boundary line of Fayette County to the northeast corner of Fayette County; thence southerly along the east boundary line of Fayette County to U.S. Highway 64; thence southwesterly along U.S. Highway 64 to its intersection with an unnamed private drive; thence northwesterly along said drive to its intersection at Old Jackson Road; thence southwesterly and southerly and westerly along Old Jackson Road to its intersection with Old Brownsville Road; thence northerly along Old Brownsville Road to its intersection with Smart Creek; thence northwesterly along Smart Creek to the point of beginning.

DISTRICT 3

Beginning at the intersection of State Highway 76 and the Loosahatchie River; from said point of beginning northwesterly and southwesterly and westerly along the Loosahatchie River to its intersection with Interstate Highway 40; thence southwesterly along Interstate Highway 40 to its intersection with State Highway 196, thence southeasterly with State Highway 196 to the intersection of Orr Road, thence southerly along Orr Road to the intersection of Harrell Drive, thence westerly with Harrell Drive to the intersection of the west boundary line of Fayette County, thence northerly along the Fayette County Line to its intersection with Beaver Creek; thence northeasterly along Beaver Creek to its intersection with the north boundary line of Fayette County; thence easterly along the north boundary line of Fayette County to its intersection with State Highway 76; thence southwesterly and southerly along State Highway 76 to the point of beginning.

DISTRICT 4

Beginning at a point at the intersection of Highway 64 and Warren Road, thence northerly along Warren Road to the intersection of Feathers Chapel Drive, thence westerly along Feathers Chapel Drive to the intersection of Rich Road, thence northerly with Rich Road to the intersection of Stafford road, thence briefly easterly with Stafford Road to the intersection of a tributary to the Loosahatchie River, thence northerly to the Loosahatchie River, thence westerly with the Loosahatchie River to the intersection of a tributary between Hillard and Wirt Road, thence

southerly with the tributary to the intersection of Wirt Road to the intersection of Black Ankle Creek, thence westerly with Black Ankle Creek to the intersection of Ivy Road, thence westerly briefly along Ivy Road to the intersection of Bell Grove Road, thence southerly with Bell Grove Road to the intersection of Highway 64, thence westerly with Highway 64 to the intersection of Watson Road, thence southerly with Watson Road to the intersection of Mallory Drive, thence easterly with Mallory Drive to the intersection of the Oakland City limits, thence southerly and easterly with the Oakland City Limits to the intersection of a tributary to the Cypress Creek Canal, thence southeasterly with the Cypress Creek Canal to the intersection of Clay Branch, thence southerly with Clay Branch to its fork and thence along the east bearing fork to the intersection of Oakland Road, thence southerly with Oakland Road to the intersection of Sellers Drive, thence easterly along Sellers Drive to the intersection of Wilbourne Road, thence northerly along Wilbourne Road to the intersection of McFadden Road, thence easterly along McFadden Road to the intersection of Warren Road, thence northerly along Warren Road to the point of beginning.

DISTRICT 5

Beginning at the southwest corner of Fayette County; from said point of beginning northerly along the west boundary line of Fayette County to its intersection with U S Highway 64, thence northeasterly along U S Highway 64 to its intersection with Sammons Drive; thence southerly and easterly along Sammons Drive to its east terminus and continuing easterly on a projected line to an unnamed tributary of Cypress Creek; thence southerly and southeasterly and easterly and southeasterly and easterly and southerly along said tributary to the Southern Railway tracks, thence easterly with the Southern railway tracks to the intersection of the Wolf River, thence southerly along the Wolf River to the intersection of Highway 57, thence westerly with Highway 57 to the intersection of Teague Branch, thence southerly along Teague Branch to its intersection with Sugar Hill Drive, thence westerly along Sugar Hill Drive to its intersection with a TVA overhead electric transmission line; thence southeasterly along the TVA overhead electric transmission line to its intersection with the south boundary line of Fayette County; thence westerly along the south boundary line of Fayette County to the point of beginning.

DISTRICT 6

Beginning at the intersection of the Wolf River and State Route 194; from said point of beginning northerly and northeasterly along State Route 194 to its intersection with Jenkins Drive; thence northerly and westerly and northerly and westerly and northerly along Jenkins Drive to its intersection with Shaws Creek; thence northeasterly along Shaws Creek to its intersection with an unnamed tributary of Shaws Creek; thence northwesterly and northerly along said tributary to its intersection with State Route 193; thence easterly along State Route 193 to its intersection with Payne Road; thence northerly along Payne Road to its intersection with Clay Pond Drive; thence northerly and westerly along Clay Pond Drive to its intersection with Simpson Drive; thence northerly and westerly along Simpson Drive to its intersection with Kyle Road; thence northerly along Kyle Road to its intersection with a TVA overhead electric transmission line; thence easterly along the TVA overhead electric transmission line to its intersection with a tributary to Clay Branch, thence northerly with the tributary to Clay Branch to the easterly tributary to Clay Branch and thence easterly to the intersection of the Oakland City Limits, thence southeasterly with the Oakland City Limits to the intersection of Sellers Drive, thence easterly along Sellers Drive to the intersection of Wilbourne Road, thence northerly along Wilbourne Road to the intersection of McFadden Drive, thence easterly along McFadden Drive to the intersection of Warren Road, thence southerly along Warren Road to the intersection of the TVA Power Transmission Lines, thence easterly with the TVA Power Transmission Lines to the intersection of an unnamed creek that runs southerly to Highway 76, thence southerly along Highway 76 to the intersection of the Williston City Limits, thence southerly and easterly with the Williston City Limits to the intersection of Bennetts Creek, thence northerly with Bennetts Creek to the intersection of LaGrange Road, thence southerly along LaGrange Road to the intersection of an unnamed road to the west, thence along this road to the intersection of a line to connect to Watkins Drive, thence westerly along Watkins Drive to the intersection of Fortune Road, thence southerly along Fortune Road to the intersection of McKinstry Road, thence northerly along McKinstry Road to the intersection of Stafford Creek, thence southerly with Stafford Creek to the intersection of another creek and northerly with the other creek to the intersection of Carryback Cove, thence along Carryback Cove to the intersection of Churchhill Downs Road, thence westerly along Churchhill Downs Road to the intersection of Good Springs Loop, thence southerly and westerly with Good Springs Loop to the intersection of a tributary to the Wolf River, thence along the Tributary to the Wolf River and westerly with the Wolf River to the point of beginning.

DISTRICT 7

Beginning at the southeast Corner of Fayette County and continuing north to the intersection of US Highway 64, thence southwesterly along US Highway 64 to the intersection of Howell Creek, thence southerly with Howell Creek to the intersection of the TVA power Transmission Lines, thence westerly with the TVA Power Transmission lines to the intersection of LaGrange Road, thence southerly along LaGrange Road to the intersection of an unnamed road to the west, thence along this road to the intersection of a line to connect to Watkins Drive, thence westerly along Watkins Drive to the intersection of Fortune Road, thence southerly along Fortune Road to the intersection of McKinstry Road, thence northerly along McKinstry Road to the intersection of Stafford Creek, thence southerly with Stafford Creek to the intersection of another creek and northerly with the other creek to the intersection of Carryback Cove, thence along Carryback Cove to the intersection of Churchhill Downs Road, thence westerly along Churchhill Downs Road to the intersection of Good Springs Loop, thence southerly and westerly with Good Springs Loop to the intersection of a tributary to the Wolf River, thence along the Tributary to the Wolf River and westerly with the Wolf River to Grissum Creek, thence southeasterly with Grissum Creek to the intersection of the Southern Railway tracks, thence easterly with the southern railway tracks to the intersection of the Wolf River, thence southerly with the Wolf River to the intersection of State Highway 57, thence westerly along State Highway 57 to the intersection of Teague Branch thence southerly with Teague Branch to the intersection of Sugar Hill Drive, thence westerly along Sugar Hill Drive to the intersection of the TVA Power Transmission lines, thence southerly with the power transmission lines to the Fayette County Line, thence easterly with the Fayette County line to the point of beginning.

DISTRICT 8

Beginning at the intersection of the west boundary line of Fayette County and U.S. Highway 64; from said point of beginning north along the west boundary line of Fayette County to its intersection with Harrell Drive, thence southeasterly along Harrell Drive to the intersection with Orr Road, thence northerly along Orr Road to the intersection of State Highway 196, thence briefly northerly along State Highway 196 to the intersection of Interstate Highway 40; thence northwesterly along Interstate Highway 40 to its intersection with the Loosahatchie River; thence southeasterly and easterly along the Loosahatchie River to its intersection with an unnamed creek approximately 1800 feet east of the intersection of the Loosahatchie River with Laurel Creek; thence southeasterly along said unnamed creek to its intersection with Wirt Road; thence southerly along Wirt Road to its intersection with Black Ankle Creek; thence westerly with Black Ankle Creek to the intersection of Ivy Road, thence westerly briefly along Ivy Road to the intersection of Bell Grove Road, thence southerly with Bell Grove Road to the intersection of Highway 64, thence westerly with Highway 64 to the intersection of Watson Road, thence southerly with Watson Road to the intersection of Mallory Drive, thence easterly with Mallory Drive to the intersection of the Oakland City limits, thence southerly and easterly with the Oakland City Limits to the intersection of a tributary to the Cypress Creek Canal, thence southwesterly along said tributary to its intersection with Cypress Creek; thence southeasterly along Cypress Creek to its intersection with Clay Branch Creek; thence southerly along Clay Branch Creek to its fork approximately four thousand (4000) feet west of State Route 194; thence along the west fork to its intersection with a TVA overhead electric transmission line; thence westerly along the TVA overhead electric transmission line to its intersection with Kyle road; thence southerly along Kyle Road to its intersection with Simpson Drive; thence easterly and southerly along Simpson Drive to its intersection with Clay Pond Drive; thence westerly along Clay Pond Drive to its intersection with Canadaville Loop; thence southerly along Canadaville Loop to its intersection with an unnamed tributary of Cypress Creek; thence northerly and westerly and northwesterly and westerly and northwesterly and northerly along said tributary to its intersection with the projected east terminus of Sammons Drive; thence westerly and northerly along Sammons Drive to its intersection with U.S. Highway 64 to the point of beginning.

SECTION 2.

a. All members of the Fayette County Legislative Body shall reside within and be qualified voters in the district which they represent.

b. The districts described in Section 1 correspond to the 2000 U.S. Census blocks as detailed in Appendix I to this Document.

SECTION 3.

If any vacancies occur during the term of the present members of the Fayette County Legislative Body, the vacancy shall be filled for the remainder of the term using the reapportionment plan in effect prior to the adoption of this plan. The present members shall serve the remainder of the term for which they were elected.

SECTION 4.

All members of the Fayette County Legislative Body shall be elected at large within the commissioner district wherein the candidate seeks election.

SECTION 5.

This plan shall take effect upon passage, the public welfare requiring it, but shall be fully implemented with the August 2002 County Legislative Body election.

Date of Passage: October 23, 2001

Mr. Carter with CTAS then reviewed a proposal for re-districting for School Board members. Discussion followed.

Motion was then made by Commissioner Graves, seconded by Commissioner Morris to approve the Resolution re-districting the Fayette County Board of Education. Roll Call Vote was taken. Voting YES: Commissioners Burnette, Doyle, Graves, German, Harris, Morris, Sullivan and Taylor. (8)

Voting NO: Commissioners Arnett, Bonner, Brewer, Cox, Kelley, Moore, Morman, Taylor and Wilson. (9)

Absent and not voting: Commissioners Logan and Tomlin.

Thereupon, said motion failed.
