

FAYETTE COUNTY LEGISLATIVE BODY

August 27, 2002

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BE IT REMEMBERED That the Fayette County Legislative Body met in regular session at the Courthouse in Somerville, Tennessee, on the 27th day of August, 2002.

Present and presiding Chairman Protempore Ronnie Harris. Also present, Dell T. Graham, County Clerk, and the following County Commissioners: John W. Arnett, Floyd Bonner, Charles Dudley Brewer, Sr., Joe B. Burnette, Jr., Odis Cox, Carl Doyle, Ronnie Graves, Willie German, David Kelley, Sylvester Logan, Calvin Moore, Alonzo Norman, Jr., David Morris, Rhea "Skip" Taylor, Wayne Thomas, Gordon M. Tomlin and Myles Wilson.

Absent: Commissioner John S. Sullivan, Sr.

With a quorum being present, the following proceedings were had and entered of record, to-wit:

Motion was made by Commissioner Logan, seconded by Commissioner Norman, and unanimously carried by the Board approving the minutes of the July 2002 meeting of this Board.

At this time Commissioner Rhea Taylor, forthcoming County Mayor, presented plaques to outgoing County Commissioners, those being Commissioners Arnett, Bonner, Brewer, Cox, Doyle, Kelley, Moore, Norman, Morris, Sullivan, Taylor, Thomas and Tomlin.

Commissioner Morris addressed the Board concerning the rezoning request of Jim Hilliard for property located in Civil District 2 to be rezoned from R - 1 to R - 3. This was approved by the Planning Commission and the Development Committee. The floor was then opened for public comments in favor of and in opposition to the rezoning. Jim Hilliard spoke in favor of the rezoning. Addressing the Board in opposition of the rezoning was Dana Pittman. The floor was then closed to the public.

Motion was then made by Commissioner Kelley, seconded by Commissioner Doyle to approve the request to rezone.

Motion was made by Commissioner Morris, seconded by Commissioner Logan to amend the motion for lots not to be less than four (4) acres. Roll call vote was taken on this motion. Voting YES: Commissioners Arnett, Bonner, Brewer, Doyle, German, Kelley, Logan, Norman, Morris, Taylor and Wilson. (11)

Voting NO: Commissioners Cox, Graves, Moore, Thomas and Tomlin. (5)
Commissioner Burnette Passed.

Said amendment to motion passed.

Vote was then taken on the original motion which passed, with Commissioner Burnette not voting.

Motion was made by Commissioner Graves, seconded by Commissioner Morris, and unanimously carried by the Board approving the following as **Notaries Public**: Miffie K. Johnson and Brenda J. Miles.

Motion was made by Commissioner Taylor, seconded by Commissioner Burnette, and unanimously carried by the Board to table the appointments to the Planning Commission until the next meeting of this Board.

A written statement from the Mayor's Office was left on the table for each Commissioner.

Commissioner Wilson reported orally for the Board of Education. Commissioner Harris then advised that there was some confusion on the recommendation for the School Board Budget and asked that that be clarified at the Special Session of August 29, 2002.

No report from the Board of Public Works.

Commissioner Morris reported orally for the Development Committee advising that four acres in the Industrial Park had been sold.

No other reports were available.

Commissioner Doyle asked that the last page of the report from the County Mayor be presented aloud before the Board.

With no other matters to be brought before the Board, said meeting adjourned.
