BE IT REMEMBERED That the Fayette County Legislative Body met in regular session at the Courthouse in Somerville, Tennessee, on the 26th day of February, 2002.

With a quorum being present, the following proceedings were had and entered of record, to-wit:

Motion was made by Commissioner Graves, seconded by Commissioner Logan and unanimously carried by the Board approving the minutes of the January 2002 meeting.

Motion was made by Commissioner Tomlin, seconded by Commissioner Sullivan, and unanimously carried by the Board adopting the following Resolution recognizing ALFRED ALLEN HODGES former County Commissioner:

RESOLUTION IN RECOGNITION OF ALFRED ALLEN HODGES YEARS OF SERVICE TO THE COMMUNITY

WHEREAS, ALFRED ALLEN HODGES retired as a Fayette County Commissioner after serving on said Commission from September, 1950 until August, 1966 and

WHEREAS, he was a lifelong resident of Hickory Withe, Tennessee;

WHEREAS, he was engaged and employed as a farmer, community leader and a County Commissioner and

WHEREAS, Alfred Allen Hodges died on Tuesday, March 27, 2001 at 8:00 P.M. at the age of eighty two (82) years of age and

WHEREAS, Alfred Allen Hodges was born May 8, 1918 in Hickory Withe Tennessee the son of the late John (Jack) Rodgers and Mary Ellen Sammons Hodges, early residents of Hickory Withe. He was a 1937 graduate of Fayette County High School. Alfred Allen Hodges served for over three years in the Army Air Corp during World War II. He was a member of the 60th Fighter Squad and was station for a period in Burma and

WHEREAS, Alfred Allen Hodges was a farmer and land owner in Hickory Withe throughout his life; he was a devoted and faithful member of the Hickory Withe Presbyterian Church where he was an officer since 1935 and

WHEREAS, he was a Fayette County Commissioner for thirty years and a Fayette County Farm Bureau director for thirty one years and

WHEREAS, he was a member of the VFW Post 5013 and was Fost Commander from 1985 to 1990 and

WHEREAS, for over forty years Alfred Hodges was Trustee of the Mt Pleasant Cemetery Association and care taker of the cemetery; and

WHEREAS, upon his retirement from farming Alfred Allen Hodges remained very active; that he volunteered at the Veterans Administration Hospital for twelve years receiving numerous service awards; that he was a regular visitor to the residents of the Somerville Nursing Home and

WHEREAS, his hobbies included restoration of antique automobiles in which he restored a 1924 Dodge and won many awards at area car shows and

WHEREAS, the 101st General Assembly of the State of Tennessee past a resolution honoring him for his services to the community, specifically his volunteer work at the Veterans Administration Hospital and his involvement with the VFW Post No. 5013 and

WHEREAS, Alfred Allen Hodges served as a spokesman of the Hickory Withe Community for many years and is well known for his love of Fayette County and Hickory Withe and

WHEREAS, Alfred Allen Hodges was instrumental in the incorporation and creation of the City of Hickory Withe in Fayette County, Tennessee and

WHEREAS, Alfred Atlen Hodges was married to Mary Otie Murrell Hodges on May 14, 1943; that he had a son, John Allen Hodges of Jackson, Tennessee, a daughter, Jane Hodges Mitchell of Hickory Withe, Tennessee; that he had three grandchildren, Terry Ann Mitchell of Hickory Withe, Tennessee, Helanie Jane Mitchell of Memphis, Tennessee and John Michael Hodges of Memphis, Tennessee and

WHEREAS, he lived an exemplary life and was a credit to his community and

WHEREAS, Fayette County, Tennessee has been diminished by his passing and the Fayette County Commission wishes to record upon its minutes its statement of admiration, respect and affection for Alfred Allen Hodges and for his lifetime of service and leadership in the community.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF FAYETTE COUNTY, TENNESSEE wishes to honor Alfred Allen Hodges for his thirty years of services to the Fayette County Board of Commissioners, for his service to the City of Hickory Withe, Tennessee and the community, for

Commissioner Graves asked the Chairman to address Item 8.3 Appointment to 911 Board. Chairman Voss advised that appointments were previously recommended by the 911 Board and the Director of 911 Board notifying when appointments were to be made. Future appointments will be made by the appropriate committee. He also advised that findings on the 922 Audit would be public record.

A written report from the Board of Public Works was filed.

Report from the Sheriff's Department was called for, but none available.

As recommended by the County Development Committee for passage, motion was made by Commissioner Morris, seconded by Commissioner Moore and unanimously carried by the Board accepting Lake Point Cove as a new subdivision road.

Commissioner Morris then addressed the problem on LEACH ROAD. This led to much discussion. Several suggestions were made to solve this problem as were several motions, which were withdrawn. Motion was then made by Commissioner Taylor, seconded by Commissioner Sullivan to allow Mrs. Thompson to obtain a plan for correction of the problem with the cost not to exceed \$8,000.00. Said motion carried with one (1) "NO" vote.

Motion was made by Commissioner Morris, seconded by Commissioner German, and unanimously carried by the Board to authorize request for proposal for engineering service for the Jail/Criminal Justice Center if this has not already been awarded to Barge-Waggoner-Summer & Cannon.

Commissioner Tomila reported orally for the Health & Welfare Committee advising that their recommendations were being presented to this Board for action.

Commissioner Brewer reported for the Personnel Committee presenting their recommendation of Drs. James Burnett, Lawrence Disc. Frank DeTaileht and Paul Scates as selective physicians for workers' compensation. Notion was made by Commissioner Moore, seconded by Commissioner Brewer and unanimously carried by the Board approving this recommendation.

The matter of additional vacation days was also addressed by that committee, but no recommendation made. Commissioner Brewer advised that office had rather have salary increases rather than additional vacation days.

No report from the Education Committee.

Commissioner Harris, Chairman of the Budget Committee, presented their recommendation to change a portion of the county boundry line between Fayette County and Tipton County. This would be southwest on Hwy 70 for approximately 5 1/2 miles involving an approximate 123 acre loss to Fayette County. Motion to approve this recommendation was made by Commissioner Harris, seconded by Commissioner Wilson, and unanimously carried by the Board.

Having been reviewed by the Budget Committee and presented with their recommendation for passage, motion was made by Commissioner Harris, seconded by Commissioner Morman and unanimously carried by the Board to participate in the Group Work Camp 2003 by funding of \$17,000.00.

Motion was made by Commissioner Harris, seconded by Commissioner Arnett and unanimously carried by the Board to accept the recommendation of the Budget Committee and approve a Resolution on prayer in public schools.

The airport runway extension was the next matter before the Board. Commissioner Harris advised that the recommendation of the Budget Committee was that this extension not be approved. Motion was then made by Commissioner Taylor, seconded by Commissioner Wilson to apply for the grant for the extension of the airport runway with appropriation for matching funds. After much discussion, the following Roll Call Vote was taken: YES: Commissioners Bonner, Brewer, Cor, Graves, Harris, Logan, Moore, Morris, Taylor, Thomas and Wilson. (11)

NO: Commissioners Arnett, Burnette, German, Morman, Sullivan and Tomlin. (6)

Absent: Commissioners Doyle and Kelley. Thereupon, said motion carried.
