MEMORANDUM

SUBJ: Library Board

It is my understanding that the Education Committee recently voted to recommend that my nomination for a position on the Fayette County Library Board be rejected by the Fayette County Commission.

Given my academic history which includes three science degrees, college level teaching as a Graduate Assistant, publications accepted by national peer-reviewed scientific journals, serving as a referee for national peer-reviewed journals, publication of a Master's Thesis at Tennessee Technological University, publication of a Doctoral Dissertation at the University of Memphis, coupled with 30 years of experience as a volunteer board member on numerous state and local boards, I doubt that my rejection was based on a lack of acceptable qualifications. Therefore, I must assume that I have been rejected for personal reasons.

One of my main goals as a member of the Fayette County Library Board would have been to augment the relationship between the Library Board and the Education Committee. An effective partnership between our local boards and our funding and oversight committees is vital for the continued success of our county's services. I realize that if I have somehow offended the members of the Education Committee, a successful partnership would have great challenges. Therefore, I think the county will be best served if I withdraw my application as a member of the Library Board.

I very humbly appreciate your considering my application and I remain dedicated to a successful future for all of Fayette County.

The next item on the agenda was the nomination of a member for the School Board District Two. Commissioner Howard moved to nominate David Lee. Commissioner Oglesby moved to nominate Jim Mitchell. After comments and discussion Commissioner Bunker made a motion to table the election until the next School Board election. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Howard and passed with 10 Commissioners voting yes and 6 Commissioners voting no.


Chairman Taylor stated that financial reports were included in Commissioner's packets and any questions should be directed to the appropriate official.





WHERE FAYETTE COUNTY'S TAX DOLLARS GO TO




WHERE FAYETTE COUNTY'S REVENUE COMES FROM

No reports were given for the Sheriff's Department, Juvenile Court, Board of Public Works, Trustee's Office, or Planning and Development. Dr. King reported for the Board of Education. The Commissioners were invited to the Fayette Ware's High school 2015 Homecoming Parade. He then introduced Deputy Superintendent, Vincent Harvell, which is responsible for the financing in the district. He will be leading the business efforts in the operation for the district.

Commissioner Wilson reported for the Development Committee which met on October 12, 2015. Commissioner Wilson was elected Chairman. The committee discussed the request from the Railroad Committee to transfer property to the Renaissance Bank. The committee decided for the Agricultural Extension Service be sent to budget.

Commissioner Reeves reported for the Health and Welfare Committee which met on October 12, 2015. Commissioner Reeves was elected as Chairman, Commissioner Legget was elected Vice-Chairman. The ambulance reports were reviewed, lost revenue may be in billing and the situation is being looked into. The committee approved for the Health Department to move funds to cover extra supplies and for the Solid Waste Fund 116 which was an additional \$231 from the Fund Balance for Liability Insurance be added to expenditures.

Commissioner Oglesby reported for Personnel Committee which met on October 12, 2015. Commissioner Oglesby was elected as Chairman, Commissioner Dacus was elected Vice-Chairman. The resolution for the Lookback Measurement was approved. Commissioner Oglesby made the motion for it to be adopted. It was seconded by Commissioner Watkins and passed unanimously.

**RESOLUTION NO. _____ OF FAYETTE COUNTY GOVERNMENT
ADOPTING THE LOOK-BACK MEASUREMENT METHOD
UNDER THE PATIENT PROTECTION AND AFFORDABLE CARE ACT**

WHEREAS, the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act ("ACA") added Section 4980H Shared Responsibility for Employers Regarding Health Care Coverage to Title 26 of the United States Code, the Internal Revenue Code (Section 4980H);

WHEREAS, Section 4980H imposes an assessable payment on an applicable large employer when either (1) it fails to offer "substantially all" of its full-time employees (and their dependents) the opportunity to enroll in minimum essential coverage, or it offers full-time employees (and their dependents) coverage that is either not affordable or does not provide minimum value, and (2) a full-time employee is certified to the employer as having received a subsidy for coverage through the exchange ("Assessable Payment");

WHEREAS, Fayette County Government is considered an applicable large employer because it employed an average of at least 50 full-time and/or full-time equivalent employees on business days during the preceding calendar year;

WHEREAS, the Department of Treasury issued final regulations regarding Section 4980H, that permit Fayette County Government to adopt a look-back measurement method in order to determine the status of an employee as full-time for purposes of determining and calculating the Assessable Payment 26 CFR Parts 1, 54, and 301, 79 Fed. Reg. 8543 (Feb. 12, 2014); and

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the County Commission of Fayette County Government as follows:

- 1) **Adoption of Look-Back Measurement Method** - Fayette County Government hereby adopts the look-back measurement method for purposes of determining employee status under Section 4980H.
- 2) **Administration of Look-Back Measurement Method** – Fayette County Government shall administer the look-back measurement method pursuant to (i) the periods identified in this resolution, and (ii) the guidance set forth in 26 CFR Parts 1, 54, and 301, 79 Fed. Reg. 8543 (Feb. 12, 2014) and other related notices and materials.
- 3) **Ongoing Employees** - Fayette County Government adopts the following periods for purposes of administering the look-back measurement method with regard to all ongoing employees for the 2016 plan year and thereafter:
 - a) **Standard Measurement Period** - Starting on 10/05/2014, a 12 month standard measurement period will begin 10/05/2014 and end on 10/04/2015. Subsequent standard measurement periods will begin on 10/05 and end on 10/04 each year thereafter.
 - b) **Standard Administrative Period** - Starting on 10/5/2015, a 88 day administrative period for ongoing employees will begin on 10/5/2015 and end on 12/31/2015. Subsequent administrative periods for ongoing employees will begin on 10/5 and end on 12/31 each year thereafter.

- c) **Standard Stability Period** - Starting on 1/1/2016, a 12 month stability period for ongoing employees will begin on 1/1/2016 and end on 12/31/2016. Subsequent stability periods for ongoing employees will begin on 1/1 and end on 12/31 each year thereafter.
- 4) **New Employees** - Fayette County Government adopts the following periods for purposes of administering the look-back measurement method with regard to new employees hired on or after 1/1/2015:
 - a. **Initial Measurement Period** - A 12 month initial measurement period will start the 1st of the calendar month after the new employee's hire date, unless the hire date is the first of a calendar month in which case the initial measurement period will start on that date.
 - b. **Initial Administrative Period** - An administrative period for new employees shall include (i) the period from hire date to the beginning of the initial measurement period, if any, and, (ii) the period following the last day of the initial measurement period through the last day of the first calendar month beginning on or after the first anniversary of the employee's hire date.
 - c. **Initial Stability Period** - A 12 month stability period for new employees will start immediately following the administrative period.

Commissioner Lillard reported for the Education Committee which met on October 13, 2015. Commissioner Lillard was elected as Chairman, Commissioner Bunker was elected Vice-Chairman. Chairman Taylor stated that he would be sending invitations out to Dr. King, Chairman Doll, and Finance Director Vincent Harvell for the November Education committee.

Commissioner Kelley reported for the Criminal Justice and Public Safety Committee which met on October 13, 2015. Commissioner Kelley was elected as Chairman, Commissioner Brewer was elected as Vice-Chairman. The committee discussed reduction of the Fund Balance by \$9,778 for the Sheriff, Jail and Fire Department liability insurance. The Sheriff's Department salary supplement was discussed and moved to the Budget Committee.







I reviewed my file on replacing school board members after the Commission voted to table replacement of the school board vacancy caused when it was learned that Mr. Garrett did not reside in the district for which he was elected. **§ 49-2-202. Members; oath; duties; conflicts of interest; compensation;
vacancies; student members**

Currentness

(a)(1) Members of the board shall be residents and voters of the county in which they are elected and shall be citizens of recognized integrity, intelligence and ability to administer the duties of the office.

(2) No member of the county legislative body nor any other county official shall be eligible for election as a member of the county board of education.

(3)(i) Each member of the board of education who has a relative employed by the board shall declare such relationship prior to voting on any matter of business that shall have an effect upon the employment of the relative. In making the declaration, such board member shall certify that the vote that is about to be cast on the pending matter is in the best interest of the school system. Such matters shall include, but shall not be limited to, the school system annual budget, tenure considerations and personnel policies. The director of schools shall give notice to the board each time there is intent to employ a relative of a school board member. The director of schools of a county school system shall also give notice to the county school board each time there is intent to employ a relative of an elected county official. The director of schools of a city school system shall also give notice to the city school board each time there is intent to employ a relative of an elected city official. In giving such notice, the director of schools shall certify that the prospective employee is duly qualified by training and licensure to occupy the position.

(ii) As used in this subdivision (a)(3), unless the context otherwise requires, "relative" means a spouse, parent, parent-in-law, child, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, grandparent, grandchild, brother, sister, uncle, aunt, nephew, niece, or any person who resides in the same household as any of the officials referenced in subdivision (a)(3)(i).

(iii) This subdivision (a)(3) shall not be construed to prohibit two (2) or more relatives from working for the LEA. If two (2) or more employees who are relatives are within the same direct line of supervision, or become within the same direct line of supervision by marriage or promotion, then the director of schools shall attempt to resolve this issue by transfer of one (1) of the employees. If the director finds that transfer is not feasible or is not in the best interest of students, then an alternate evaluation plan shall be devised for one (1) of the employees.

(4) No person shall be eligible to serve on the board unless the person is a bona fide resident of the county and has a practical education; provided, that beginning on October 1, 1990, except in counties having a population of:

qualify as a candidate for a position on a county board of education until the person has filed with the county election commission proof that the candidate graduated from high school or received a GED®, evidenced by a diploma or other documentation satisfactory to the commission. Any person serving on a school board as of October 1, 1990, shall be allowed to continue to serve and to seek reelection or reappointment to one (1) additional term even though the person may not have graduated from high school or received a GED®.

(5) If any member ceases to reside in the county, the office of the member shall become vacant.

(6) All board members shall be properly trained during their service on the board of education. The minimum requirements for this training shall be established by the state board of education and shall include an annual session for all board members.

(b) All members of the local board of education shall take oath to discharge faithfully the duties of the office.

(c) It is the duty of the board of education to:

(1) Hold regular meetings at least quarterly for the purpose of transacting public school business; provided, that the chair may call special meetings whenever in the chair's judgment the interest of the public schools requires it, or when requested to do so by a majority of the board. The chair or the chair's designee shall give reasonable notice of the time and location of all meetings to the president of the local education association or the president's designee; and

(2) Elect one (1) of its members as chair annually.

(d) The compensation of members of the county board shall be fixed by the county legislative body for their services when attending regular and special meetings and discharging the duties imposed by this title; provided, that the county trustee shall pay no voucher issued to members unless the voucher has been approved by the county mayor; and provided, further, that no member of any board shall receive less than four dollars (\$4.00) per day for the member's services.

(e)(1) When a vacancy occurs, the unexpired term shall be filled at the next regular meeting of the county legislative body or at a special meeting of the county legislative body.

(2) Vacancies shall be declared to exist, on account of death, resignation or removal from the county.

(3) A temporary absence of a county board member to serve in the military shall not constitute a vacancy in office and such absence shall not be subject to the requirements of § 8-48-205(5).

(f) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the board of education for each LEA that operates one (1) or more high schools may annually select, prior to commencement of the new school year, no less than four (4) high school students to serve as advisory, nonvoting members of the board. One half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the students so selected shall be enrolled in the college preparatory track and one half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the students so selected shall be enrolled in the technology track. The students shall serve without compensation but may, at the discretion of the board, be reimbursed for reasonable and necessary expenses incurred while engaged in board business.

(g) A majority of all of the members constituting the board, and not merely a majority of the quorum, shall be required to transact all business coming before the board in regular or special meetings.

Question 1

Why are county commissioners, who have no education requirements and who are not as familiar as a **school board** with county education issues, allowed to appoint **school board** members?

Opinion 1

Article VII, Section 2, of the Tennessee Constitution requires local legislative bodies to make appointments to fill **vacancies** that occur on local **school boards** until the next election.

Question 2

Would amending Tennessee Code Annotated §§ 49-2-201(a)(1) and -202(e) to allow the members of a county **school board** to appoint new members to fill **vacancies** violate Article VII, Section 2, of the Tennessee Constitution?

Opinion 2

Yes.

ANALYSIS

Article VII, Section 2, of the Tennessee Constitution provides that "[v]acancies in county offices shall be filled by the county legislative body, and any person so appointed shall serve until a successor is elected at the next election occurring after the vacancy and is qualified." A member of a county **school board** is a "county officer" as that term is used in Article VII, Section 2. *Marion County Bd. Of Commissioners v. Marion County Election Commission*, 594 S.W. 2d 681, 686 n. 5 (Tenn. 1980).

Since county **school board** members are county officers, and since county officers must be appointed by the county legislative body, it follows that the county legislative body—here the county commission—must fill **vacancies** that occur on county **school boards**. See, Tenn. Op. Atty. Gen. 10-88 (July 28, 2010) (**vacancies** on county boards of education) Tenn. Op. Atty. Gen. 10-26 (March 8, 2010) (**vacancies** on **school boards** in general); Tenn. Op. Atty. Gen. 81-108 (February 13, 1981) (**vacancy** on county board where private act conflicts with Tenn. Constitution).

Consistent with Article VII, Section 2, of the Tennessee Constitution, Tenn. Code Ann. § 49-2-201(a)(1) provides that **vacancies** on a county board of education shall be filled by the local legislative body:

[...] Members of county boards of education shall be residents of and elected from districts of substantially equal population established by resolution of the local legislative body. Members of special school district boards of education shall be elected according to special or private act, but shall be popularly elected on a staggered term basis.

In special school districts, vacancies on the board arising from death or resignation shall be filled by the special school district school board. Any person so appointed shall serve until a successor is elected and qualifies according to law. The successor shall be elected at the next general election for which candidates have a sufficient time to qualify under the law.
[...].

*2 (Emphasis added).

Likewise consistent with Article VII, Section 2, of the Tennessee Constitution, Tenn. Code Ann. § 49-2-202(e) provides, regarding county boards of education, that "[w]hen a vacancy occurs, the unexpired term shall be filled at the next regular meeting of the county legislative body or at a special meeting of the county legislative body."

However, amending Tenn. Code Ann. §§ 49-2-201(a)(1) and -202(e) to allow the county school board—rather than the county legislative body—to appoint new members would be totally inconsistent with Article VII, Section 2. Such an amendment would permit members of a county school board to fill vacancies on their own board and would not comply with the Article VII, Section 2, requirement that those vacancies be filled by the local legislative body, in this case the county commission. The proposed amendment would, therefore, be unconstitutional.

are not applicable to general statewide restructuring provisions in 1978 legislation made necessary by constitutional amendments; however, where the general assembly has made a permanent general provision applicable to nearly 90 counties, it could not make different provisions for two of the counties by population bracket. *Leech v. Wayne County*, 588 S.W.2d 270 (Tenn. 1979).

When the general assembly authorizes any deviation from the government provided for in this article, such action must be ratified by the people in a referendum called for that purpose. *State ex rel. Maner v. Leech*, 588 S.W.2d 534 (Tenn. 1979).

7. Time and Manner of Qualification for Office.

The Constitution of 1834 simply prescribed the mode of the appointment, and the duration of the term of office. The time and manner of the qualification were left to be regulated by the general assembly, and the official term commenced under statute from the date of qualification, and not from the day of election. *State ex rel. Nolin v. Parchmen*, 40 Tenn. 609 (1859). But under the Constitution of 1870, the term of each officer elected on the first Thursday in August shall be computed from the first day of September there after; and the terms of the office of governor and other state executive offices shall be computed from the fifteenth of January. (Note in Shannon's constitution.)

8. Removal of Officeholders.

Where there is no tenure of office fixed by the constitution or statute, the person appointed and filling the office is not entitled to hold it during good behavior but is subject to removal by the appointing power; and the removal may be effected by the appointment of another to fill the office. *Ex parte Hennen*, 38 U.S. 230, 10 L. Ed. 138 (1839); *Williams v. Boughner*, 46 Tenn. 486 (1869); *Blake v. United States*, 103 U.S. 227, 26 L. Ed. 462 (1881).

The general assembly has the authority to prescribe the mode of procedure whereby officeholders are removed. *Jordan v. State ex rel. Williams*, 217 Tenn. 307, 397 S.W.2d 383 (1965).

9. Filling of Vacancies.

Under the Constitution of 1834, the register, or other county officer, elected to fill a vacancy held for the full constitutional term of office, and not merely to the end of the term in which the vacancy occurred. *Powers v. Hurst*, 21 Tenn. 24 (1840); *Brewer v. Davis*, 28 Tenn. 208 (1848); *Keys v. Mason*, 35 Tenn. 6 (1855); *State ex rel. Burns v. Clark*, 38 Tenn. 369 (1858); *Ex parte Cross & Mercer*, 84 Tenn. 486 (1886), overruled

on other grounds, 111 Tenn. 234, 80 S.W. 750 (1903); *State ex rel. Rambo v. Maloney*, 92 Tenn. 62, 20 S.W. 419 (1892); *McCulley v. State*, 102 Tenn. 509, 53 S.W. 134 (1899) (last in the dissenting opinion); *Redistricting Cases*, 111 Tenn. 234, 80 S.W. 750 (1903).

But under the Constitution of 1870 (Art. 7, § 5), a vacancy in office is filled for the unexpired term only. *Ex parte Cross & Mercer*, 84 Tenn. 486 (1886), overruled on other grounds, 111 Tenn. 234, 80 S.W. 750 (1903); *State ex rel. Rambo v. Maloney*, 92 Tenn. 62, 20 S.W. 419 (1892); *McCulley v. State*, 102 Tenn. 509, 53 S.W. 134 (1899).

10. Recitals of Tax Deed.

The recitals made in a tax deed as required by law constitute prima facie evidence of the facts so recited, and the deed is valid evidence of title in any court of law or equity, whether the sheriff who made the sale under a statute requiring tax sales to be made by sheriffs, or his successor (13 years thereafter) executed the deed. *Sheafer v. Mitchell*, 109 Tenn. 181, 71 S.W. 86 (1902).

11. Municipal Officers.

This article relates to state and county officers but not to municipal officer. *City of Elizabethton v. Carter County*, 204 Tenn. 452, 321 S.W.2d 822 (1958).

12. Apportionment Issues.

Approval by federal court of county apportionment plan, where federal court only approved plan as it related to the federal constitution, was not determinative of the issue of whether the apportionment plan violated the Constitution of Tennessee, and therefore petition to rehear based on the federal decision was denied. *State ex rel. Peel v. Shelby County*, 564 S.W.2d 371 (Tenn. Ct. App. 1976).

13. Validity of Acts Prior to 1978 Amendment.

The 1978 amendment to the constitution providing for form of county government and the legislation implementing those changes cannot be relied upon to give validity to an act in effect prior to the effective date of the amendment, unless the amendment contains an express retroactive provision or expressly refers to the act. *County of Shelby v. Blanton*, 595 S.W.2d 72 (Tenn. Ct. App. 1978).

14. Uniform Structure of County Governments.

The constitution does not mandate a uniform structure of county governments across the state. *Leech v. Wayne County*, 588 S.W.2d 270 (Tenn. 1979).

Until such time as the general assembly speaks affirmatively and with specificity on the subject, the phrase "next election," considered in the context of Tenn. Const. VII, § 5, voicing the constitutional impediment that elections of judicial and civil officers elected on the first Thursday in August "from thereafter" and when considered in the light of almost two centuries of custom, tradition, and practice, must be held to mean the next August general election. *McPherson v. Everett*, 594 S.W.2d 677 (Tenn. 1980).

The phrase, "next election occurring after vacancy" does not include any primary election. *McPherson v. Everett*, 594 S.W.2d 677 (Tenn. 1980).

2. Construction.

This section is not self-executing and dependent upon the adoption of legislation in Knox County is effective on and after September 1, 1980, when the county legislative body is inducted into office but until that time the appointive power resides in the quorum court. *State ex rel. VII, § 5, voicing the constitutional imperative that elections of judicial and civil officers be elected on the first Thursday in August "forever thereafter" and when considered in the light of almost two centuries of custom, tradition, habit and practice, must be held to mean the regular August general election. *McPherson v. Everett*, 594 S.W.2d 677 (Tenn. 1980).

The phrase, "next election occurring after the vacancy" does not include any primary election. *McPherson v. Everett*, 594 S.W.2d 677 (Tenn. 1980).

2. Construction.

This section is not self-executing and is dependent upon the adoption of legislation and as to Knox County is effective on and after September 1, 1980, when the county legislative body is inducted into office but until that time the appointive power resides in the quarterly court. *State ex rel. Maner v. Leech*, 588 S.W.2d 534 (Tenn. 1979).

The county legislative body may fill a vacancy pending the August election. This is the clear mandate of Tenn. Const., art. VII, § 2. *Marion County Bd. of Comm'rs v. Marion*

County Election Comm'n, 594 S.W.2d 681 (Tenn. 1980).

This provision is somewhat ambiguous and is not self-executing. *McPherson v. Everett*, 594 S.W.2d 677 (Tenn. 1980).

3. Temporary Judges.

Section 17-2-116(a)(1) does not violate this section or Tenn. Const., art. XI, § 17 since neither constitutional provision applies to the designation of temporary special general sessions court judges who substitute for but do not replace the incumbent judge. *State ex rel. Witcher v. Bilbrey*, 878 S.W.2d 587 (Tenn. Ct. App. 1994).

4. County Officers.

There are many county offices other than those enumerated in Tenn. Const., art. VII, § 1, and since general words rather than restrictive ones were chosen in this section, the appointing power set out in this section extends to all county offices including, but not limited to, those county offices specified in Tenn. Const., art. VII, § 1. *State ex rel. Winstead v. Moody*, 596 S.W.2d 811 (Tenn. 1980).

The overall duties of the clerk of the circuit court and general sessions court of Knox County are applicable to the people of Knox County alone; therefore the office is a county office. *State ex rel. Webster v. LaBonte*, 597 S.W.2d 893 (Tenn. 1980).

5. —General Sessions Judge.

Since the court found that in creating the office of judge of the general sessions court there was no legislative intent apparent to create a court with jurisdiction beyond the borders of the county, that the county bore the expenses of the court, paid the judge's salary, and was entitled to the fees collected by the court and that the overall duties are applicable to the people of the county alone, it was held that the general sessions court was a county rather than a state office. *State ex rel. Winstead v. Moody*, 596 S.W.2d 811 (Tenn. 1980).

6. —Juvenile Court Judge.

A juvenile court judge is a county officer, and Tenn. Const., art. VII, § 2, authorizes the county legislative body to fill vacancies. *Marion County Bd. of Comm'rs v. Marion County Election Comm'n*, 594 S.W.2d 681 (Tenn. 1980).

7. —Probate Judges.

The statutes make it clear that the county court is the probate court. The 1978 constitutional amendments superseded this court. Viewed realistically the probate court is just as much a part of our judicial system as the juvenile court. Probate judges are county officers. *Marion County Bd. of Comm'rs v. Marion County Election Comm'n*, 594 S.W.2d 681 (Tenn. 1980).

8. —State Officers Distinguished.

The primary badge of a state officer is that the general assembly provides that the state pay the salary of the office. *State ex rel. Winstead v. Moody*, 596 S.W.2d 811 (Tenn. 1980).

9. Constitutionality of Statutes.

When properly construed there is no conflict between § 5-5-102 and Tenn. Const., art. VII, § 2. Both the constitutional provision and the statute provide for the vacancy to be filled by the legislative body. *Marion County Bd. of Comm'rs v. Marion County Election Comm'n*, 594 S.W.2d 681 (Tenn. 1980).

Section 49-2-202 is constitutional to the extent of the temporary appointment to a vacancy. *Marion County Bd. of Comm'rs v. Marion County Election Comm'n*, 594 S.W.2d 681 (Tenn. 1980).

There is no constitutional infirmity in Art. VII, § 2, 103 (obsolete), providing that should a vacancy occur in the office of county judge in counties wherein the judge is temporarily acting as county executive: (1) If a vacancy occurs prior to the qualifying date for the election of a county executive, the county legislative body shall appoint a county executive to serve until a county executive is elected in the regular August election; and (2) if a vacancy occurs after the qualifying date for the election of a county executive, the county legislative body shall appoint a county executive to serve until a county executive is elected in the next general election or other county-wide election in such county. *Marion County Bd. of Comm'rs v. Marion County Election Comm'n*, 594 S.W.2d 681 (Tenn. 1980).

Irrespective of the language used, the general assembly, acting in order to avoid having duplicating offices, and purely as a transitional measure, giving a county executive authority and charging him with the attendant upon the office of county executive, is a constitutional orderly transition. *Marion County Bd. of Comm'rs v. Marion County Election Comm'n*, 594 S.W.2d 681 (Tenn. 1980).

10. Special Elections.

A special election would not be conducted pursuant to Tenn. Const., art. VII, § 2, in the virtue of the implied recognition that special elections are proper under Tenn. Const., art. VII, § 5 and art. IV, relating to elections. *McPherson v. Everett*, 594 S.W.2d 677 (Tenn. 1980).

vacancy in the office of the clerk of court is involved, may be exercised by the quarterly county court composed of a specified number of the justices or by the judge or chairman of the county court in accordance with statutes enacted in pursuance of this power, when properly construed. *Marion County Bd. of Comm'rs v. Marion County Election Comm'n*, 594 S.W.2d 681 (Tenn. 1980).

Persons Appointed.

The Constitution of 1834, a vacancy in the office of sheriff, trustee, or register, was to be filled by the people, occurring subsequent to an election, was to be filled by the general assembly until the next election of the county officers, when the office was to be filled by the qualified voters, and the person elected to fill the office held for a constitutional term of office, and not more than one year of the term in which the vacancy occurred, and such term could not be shorter than one year. *Rowers v. Hurst*, 21 Tenn. 24 (1828); *Davis*, 28 Tenn. 208 (1848); *Keiser*, 36 Tenn. 6 (1855); *State ex rel. Burdette*, 36 Tenn. 369 (1858); *Ex parte Crockett*, 46 Tenn. 486 (1886), overruled on certiorari, 111 Tenn. 234, 80 S.W. 750 (1903); *Rambo v. Maloney*, 92 Tenn. 6 (1892); *McCulley v. State*, 102 Tenn. 134 (1899); *Redistricting Commission*, 134 S.W. 234, 80 S.W. 750 (1903); *State ex rel. Malone*, 131 Tenn. 149, 174 S.W. 2d 149 (1914).

1. Meaning of Terms.

The word "justices" used in this section of the constitution means the justices of the peace of the county assembled in the quarterly county court, for it is in such collective capacity that they must make the elections required of them. *Pope v. Phifer*, 50 Tenn. 682 (1871), overruled on other grounds, 126 Tenn. 106, 148 S.W. 229 (1912); *Prescott v. Duncan*, 126 Tenn. 106, 148 S.W. 229 (1912).

2. Quarterly County Court Impliedly Recognized as Constitutional Court.

The quarterly county court is impliedly recognized and continued by the provision in the

preceding section authorizing the justices of the peace to elect a coroner and ranger, and the provision in this section authorizing justices to fill the vacancies occurring in the office of sheriff, trustee, and register, and the provision (Tenn. Const., art. XI, § 17) that the quarterly county court may be authorized to fill the offices created by the general assembly, these powers can be performed by the quarterly county court only when assembled in the body known as the quarterly county court. *Prescott v. Duncan*, 126 Tenn. 106, 148 S.W. 229 (1912).

3. Vacancies Filled By County Court.

The right and power to fill a vacancy in the office of clerk of the county court is vested in the quarterly county court, composed of the justices of the peace of the county, and not to the judge or chairman of the county court. *State ex rel. Johnson v. Campbell*, 76 Tenn. 74 (1882).

It is competent for the general assembly to provide by statute that this power of filling a vacancy in the office of clerk, conferred by the constitution upon the "court," when the

person appointed or elected by the quarterly county court to fill a vacancy in the office holds only until the next election of county officers, and the quarterly county court may elect the person elected by the voters to fill the office. *Rivers*, 66 Tenn. 295 (1874). Under the Constitution of 1870 (Art. VII, § 17) the appointment or election to fill a vacancy in the office of clerk of the county court will be made for a period extending beyond the unexpired term. *Ex parte Crockett*, 46 Tenn. 486 (1886), overruled on certiorari, 111 Tenn. 234, 80 S.W. 750 (1903); *Rambo v. Maloney*, 92 Tenn. 6 (1892).

Treasurer and Comptroller.

The office of treasurer and a Comptroller of the public accounts of both houses of the General Assembly shall be elected for a term of four years:

In accordance with statutes enacted in pursuance of this power, when properly construed, the quarterly county court composed of the justices of the county, or three-fifths thereof as a quorum, is empowered to fill the vacancy in the office of the clerk of the county court. State ex rel. Johnson v. Campbell, 76 Tenn. 74 (1881). See §§ 5-512 — 5-516 (now §§ 5-5-111 — 5-5-114).

4. Terms of Persons Appointed.

Under the Constitution of 1834, a vacancy in the office of sheriff, trustee, or register, and clerks elective by the people, occurring subsequent to an election, was to be filled temporarily by appointment until the next election for any of the county officers, when the office was to be filled by the qualified voters, and the person so elected to fill the office held for the full constitutional term of office, and not merely to the end of the term in which the vacancy occurred, and such term could not be shortened by statute. Powers v. Hurst, 21 Tenn. 24 (1840); Brewer v. Davis, 28 Tenn. 208 (1848); Keys v. Mason, 35 Tenn. 6 (1855); State ex rel. Burns v. Clark, 38 Tenn. 369 (1858); Ex parte Cross & Mercer, 84 Tenn. 486 (1886), overruled on other grounds, 111 Tenn. 234, 80 S.W. 750 (1903); State ex rel. Rambo v. Maloney, 92 Tenn. 62, 20 S.W. 419 (1892); McCulley v. State, 102 Tenn. 509, 53 S.W. 134 (1899); Redistricting Cases, 111 Tenn. 234, 80 S.W. 750 (1903); State ex rel. Gann v. Malone, 131 Tenn. 149, 174 S.W. 257 (1915).

The person appointed or elected by the quarterly county court to fill a vacancy in the register's office holds only until the next regular election for county officers, and the qualification of the person elected by the voters. Tatum v. Rivers, 66 Tenn. 295 (1874).

But under the Constitution of 1870 (Art. 7, § 5), no appointment or election to fill a vacancy shall be made for a period extending beyond the unexpired term. Ex parte Cross & Mercer, 84 Tenn. 486 (1886), overruled on other grounds, 111 Tenn. 234, 80 S.W. 750 (1903); State ex rel. Rambo v. Maloney, 92 Tenn. 62, 20

S.W. 419 (1892); McCulley v. State, 102 Tenn. 509, 53 S.W. 134 (1899); State ex rel. Gann v. Malone, 131 Tenn. 149, 174 S.W. 257 (1915).

Under §§ 1, 2, 5 of this article, where an appointment is made to fill an unexpired term, there is a vacancy at the end of such term, since the appointee must continue to perform the duties of the office as an officer holding over, if another is not elected and qualified, and he does not hold as under a prolonged term, that is, for another full term, as in the case of an officer elected for a definite term and until his successor is elected and qualified. State ex rel. Gann v. Malone, 131 Tenn. 149, 174 S.W. 257 (1915).

Where the length of term of an office only is fixed, with no set date for its beginning or ending, and no reference to an unexpired term, or to a vacancy in the term of office, as distinguished from a vacancy in the office itself, an incumbent appointed to fill a vacancy holds for a full term, and not merely for the unexpired portion of his predecessor's term. State ex rel. Gann v. Malone, 131 Tenn. 149, 174 S.W. 257 (1915).

5. Holdovers.

Under § 1 of this article, providing for the election of the sheriff for the term of two years; under this section, providing that if a vacancy occurs in the office of sheriff, subsequent to an election, it shall be filled by the justices; and under § 5 of this article, providing that the term of the officer shall be computed from the first day of September next succeeding the election; that no appointment to fill a vacancy shall be made for a period extending beyond the unexpired term, and that every officer shall hold office until his successor is elected and appointed and qualified, the justices in the quarterly court cannot appoint a successor to one who was elected sheriff, but died before qualification, since there can be no appointment unless there is a vacancy, and there can be no vacancy so long as the former elected sheriff holds over or is prolonged until the qualification of his successor; for the word "vacancy" is used in its ordinary sense as meaning empty of an incumbent, or without an incumbent. State ex rel. Gann v. Malone, 131 Tenn. 149, 174 S.W. 257 (1915).

Sec. 3. Treasurer and comptroller. — There shall be a Treasurer or Treasurers and a Comptroller of the Treasury appointed for the State, by the joint vote of both houses of the General Assembly, who shall hold their offices for two years.

What is the Exchange Club-Carl Perkins Center for the Prevention of Child Abuse?

The Exchange Club-Carl Perkins Center for the Prevention of Child Abuse (the Center) is a Tennessee not-for-profit corporation, licensed as a child abuse prevention agency. This organization is recognized as tax exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

What is the Center's mission?

The mission of the Center is to provide support to families in preventing and dealing with child abuse in West Tennessee and to help both parents and children meet the practical needs of preserving and improving the quality of family life.

When did the Center begin serving West Tennessee?

At the 1979 National Convention, the Exchange Club adopted child abuse prevention as its primary focus of service. Representatives from the Jackson Exchange Club were present at the convention and immediately began working on establishing a child abuse prevention center upon their return to Jackson. Around the same time, legendary Rock-a-Billy artist, Carl Perkins, was spurred to action by the media coverage of a local young boy who had died as the result of child abuse. Through a grant from the National Exchange Club Foundation and the fundraising efforts of club members and Carl, the Center was founded in October 1981. Since that time, the Center has continued to grow and expand its program and services into many other West Tennessee counties and has served thousands of children and their families.

Where is the Center located?

The Center has 18 locations throughout West Tennessee in the following counties:

How can I receive help?

Services are available to anyone in West Tennessee at no charge. You may contact the Center anytime by calling our 24-hour toll free hotline at **1-800-273-4744**

What services does the Center provide?

Services offered include a 24-hour crisis hotline, crisis intervention, parent training and parenting groups, divorce education program, child advocacy services, child victims program, child sexual abuse victim's group, relative caregiver program, drug endangered/exposed children's program, supervised/therapeutic visitation, emergency assistance, food and clothing assistance, relative caregiver program, child abuse prevention and community awareness programs.

How many people does the Center serve?

In the 2014-2015 fiscal year, the Center served 16,809 individuals across West Tennessee. 10,033 of those served were children, with the other 6,776 being adults.

How is the Center structured?

The Center is governed by a local volunteer board of directors comprised of business and professional leaders and persons familiar with the needs of social service programs. The Central Board Chairman for the 2015-2016 is Randy Wallace. The President/CEO of the Center is Pam Nash, who holds a Masters Degree in Counseling and Personnel and has thirty plus years of social work and administrative experience. All professional staff have at least a bachelors degree in the area of social work, counseling or a related field.

How is the Center funded?

The Center's annual operating budget is 3.6 million dollars. 47% of our funding comes from state and federal grants, 3% from United Way, 3% from local government allocations and 47% from individual and corporate donations within the community.

What is a Child Advocacy Center?

A Child Advocacy Center is designed to be a safe, child-friendly environment where children, who have been the victims of physical or sexual abuse, can talk about the trauma they have experienced and begin the healing process. Law enforcement officials, the District Attorney's Office, Juvenile Court, the Department of Children's Services and other agencies who are involved in the investigation, prosecution and treatment of child abuse cases all come together as a cohesive unit to work for the child's best interests.

The first thing you will notice about our Advocacy Centers is how much they look like homes instead of office or clinical settings. This is done so that the child does not feel threatened by his or her surroundings; thus, the focus can be on the healing process rather than the unfamiliar environment. The Advocacy Center allows each child's needs to remain the focal point of the process, rather than transporting the child from agency to agency for the grueling process of discovery, medical exams and treatment.

What is the difference between the Exchange Club-Carl Perkins Center for the Prevention of Child Abuse and the Exchange Clubs?

The Exchange Club-Carl Perkins Center for the Prevention of Child Abuse is a not-for-profit child abuse prevention agency. The Exchange Club is an all-volunteer, national service organization known to millions as America's Service Club. The Exchange Club is open to anyone who wants to serve their community, develop leadership skills and enjoy new friendships. Exchange is made up of some 900 clubs and 30,000 members throughout the United States and Puerto Rico.

The Center and the Exchange Clubs of West Tennessee share close relationship. Club members offer support to our centers throughout West Tennessee in a variety of activities such as serving on local Center boards, chairing and coordinating fundraising projects and serving in a variety of volunteer roles.

VICTIM'S SERVICE FEE – CARL PERKINS CENTER RESOLUTION

November 24, 2015

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated §40-24-109, allows for any county legislative body to establish a "Victim's Assistance Assessment" of \$45.00, to fund a program which assists victims of crime; and

WHEREAS, this assessed fee will be collected from any person who: A) enters a plea of guilty; B) is found guilty by a judge or jury; C) enters a plea of nolo contendere; D) enters a plea pursuant to any of the diversionary sentencing statutes to any criminal offense described in subsection (d); E) is found guilty, or enters a plea of guilty or nolo contendere to the offense of attempting or conspiring to commit any such offense; F) is found to be criminally responsible as a principal for the commission of any such offense; (d) except as provided in subsection (e), the provisions of subsection (c) shall apply to any conduct made criminal by the laws of this state.

(e) This section shall not apply to: (1) crimes for which the law imposes as a maximum possible punishment a fine of less than five hundred dollars (\$500) and no imprisonment; and (2) violation of the motor vehicle laws except driving under the influence of an intoxicant as prohibited by §55-10-205, where the reckless driving was proximately caused by the use of an intoxicant; (f) whether a person convicted of a is exempted from payment of the assessment imposed by this section shall be determined by the offense for which such person was convicted and the maximum possible sentence authorized by law for such person actually receives; (g) (1) the victims assistance assessment shall be subject to the provision of §8-21-401 and shall be in addition to all other taxes, costs, and fines.

WHEREAS, the Exchange Club's Carl Perkins Child Advocacy Center serves child victims of severe sexual and physical abuse by offering services such as forensic interviews, court preparation, and victims advocacy; and

WHEREAS, The Exchange Club's Carl Perkins Child Advocacy Center requests to become the designated recipient of this fee. 



AVIATION FUELS CONTRACT

THIS AGREEMENT entered into this 1st day of December, 2015, by and between EASTERN AVIATION FUELS, INC. of New Bern, North Carolina, hereinafter called "Seller" and the FAYETTE COUNTY AIRPORT, hereinafter called "Buyer" as follows:

1. AGREEMENT: Seller agrees to sell and deliver, and Buyer agrees to purchase, receive and pay for from Seller, Buyer's entire requirements of aviation fuels for use or resale at the Fayette County Airport, at or near Somerville, TN.

2. TERM: This contract shall remain in force for a period of three (3) years beginning on the 1st day of December, 2015, and for successive periods of twelve months each thereafter, unless and until terminated by either party upon notice in writing given at least thirty days before the end of any such twelve-month period.

3. DELIVERIES: The aviation fuels sold and purchased hereunder shall be the regular grade or grades of aviation fuels as currently supplied by EASTERN AVIATION FUELS, INC. and deliveries to Buyer hereunder shall be by tank truck at the place of business of Buyer at said Airport in approximately even quantities in such amounts (not less than I.C.C. minimum delivery at any one time) and at such times during business hours as Buyer may direct. It is understood that Seller's obligation hereunder is limited to such grade or grades of aviation fuels as are distributed by Seller, at the time and place of delivery hereunder.

4. PRICING: Buyer agrees to pay for the aviation fuels covered by this contract at Seller's posted dealer price. As herein used, the words "Seller's posted dealer price" mean the price posted and displayed at the time of delivery, at Seller's office at location shown in paragraph 13 hereafter.

5. TERMS: If Seller shall extend credit to Buyer, Buyer agrees to pay for all such aviation fuels via check, depending on the bi-monthly billing cycle that the city uses, from invoice date. Seller reserves the right to withdraw these terms and demand certified cash payments on delivery without assigning any cause for such action. The failure or refusal of Buyer to comply with the requirements which the Seller may impose hereunder as to payment shall entitle the Seller to suspend delivery pending such failure or refusal or to terminate this agreement forthwith. The suspension or termination of this agreement because of the failure of Buyer to perform any of the agreements herein contained shall not in any way prejudice Seller's other rights hereunder.

If Buyer's account with Eastern Aviation Fuels is in arrears, the Buyer hereby agrees that the Seller, at his discretion, may request credit card companies to reimburse Eastern Aviation Fuels with Buyer's credit card receipts and hereby authorizes the credit card company to send credit card reimbursement to Eastern Aviation Fuels.

It is further agreed that the Seller, in lieu of reimbursing Buyer for credit card

receipts, may apply the reimbursement to the outstanding balance on Buyer's account.

6. ATTORNEY AND/OR COLLECTION FEES: If the Buyer becomes in default of the terms of this agreement, Buyer agrees to a late payment charge on any delinquent balance in the amount of 1.5% per month, 18.0% per annum or the maximum amount permitted by law from the date of default. Buyer agrees to pay any attorney or collection fees if incurred in the collection of any delinquent balance or the enforcement of this contract.

7. TAXES, FEES, AND AIRPORT CHARGES: Any tax or other charge imposed by any governmental authority or other agency upon the commodity herein sold, or on the production, sale, transportation, or delivery thereof, or any feature thereof or of this agreement, existing at the time of delivery thereunder, shall be added to the price hereunder and paid by Buyer.

8. FAILURE TO PERFORM: If Seller's supplier should at any time during the life of this contract discontinue the marketing of any or all grades of aviation fuels in Buyer's territory, Seller shall be relieved of all obligation to sell or deliver such discontinued grade or grades to Buyer and Buyer shall be at liberty to purchase such discontinued grade or grades from other sources.

9. CONDITIONS: All orders hereunder will be filled with reasonable promptness, but it is mutually agreed that Seller shall not be obligated to furnish goods hereunder, nor be liable in damages for failure to do so, in the event acts of God, strikes, difficulties with its workers, lockouts, fires, foreign or domestic governmental authority, war conditions in this and any foreign country, accident, delays by railway or other methods of transportation, or other causes beyond its control, shall render it impossible for Seller to do.

10. TRADEMARKS: Seller grants to Buyer a nonexclusive, non-transferable right to use the "Shell Aviation" brand or licensed trademark in connection with the sale of Aviation Fuel at Buyer's FBO. Buyer will conform to the branding rules of usage set forth by Seller. Nonconformance to these rules will result in the de-branding of the Buyer's FBO.

11. HEALTH, SAFETY & ENVIRONMENTAL ("HS&E") COMPLIANCE:

(a) Product Handling - Buyer shall exercise extreme caution in the storing, handling, and dispensing of Aviation Fuel, including daily inspection of all storage and dispensing equipment to prevent or eliminate contamination in any form, including commingling with other fuels. Buyer shall, immediately notify Seller of any instance of Aviation Fuel contamination or commingling with other fuels.

(b) Environmental Compliance - Buyer shall observe any and all federal, state, and municipal laws, ordinances, rules and regulations, user permits, and the like pertaining to the composition, handling, storage and dispensing of Aviation Fuel purchased hereunder including, without limitation, any and all laws, ordinances, rules and regulations pertaining to the volatility or vapor pressure of Aviation Fuel and the storage of same in aboveground or underground storage tanks. Buyer shall comply with any reasonable program instituted by Seller to assure compliance with any such laws, ordinances, rules and regulations.

12. INSURANCE TO BE MAINTAINED BY BUYER: Buyer shall purchase and maintain at Buyer's expense the following insurance coverage in order to be a branded Shell Aviation FBO:

(a) Commercial General Liability Insurance, including premises and operations as well as products/completed operations liability for aviation products and refueling operations with minimum limits of five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) without restrictive per person sub-limits for bodily injury and/or property damage.

(b) Name both Shell Aviation, d.b.a. Shell Oil Products Company U.S., LLC and Eastern Aviation Fuels, Inc., as additional insured parties with respect to liability arising from Buyers aviation operations. Operations including refueling, de-fueling and/or lubrication of aircraft.

Excess Aviation Refueling Liability Insurance in the amount of 50 million dollars (\$50,000,000) will be provided Buyer free of charge provided Buyer secures and maintains said underlying insurance.

In the event Buyer is able to secure said insurance, only with \$100,000 per-person sub-limits for bodily injury Buyer will be permitted to be a branded Shell Aviation FBO, but will not be eligible for the 50 million excess liability insurance program.


